		Fr Sean -reported on the last clergy meeting held on 18th February.			
		i. There had been a robust discussion on the Easter booklet. Parishes had agreed			
		to reduce their numbers if required.			
		ii. Fr Jithu has taken over responsibility for trying to introduce more Adoration of			
		the Blessed Sacrament in our pastoral area. He had already met with our			
		representatives who had attended the Eucharistic Congress. They had been			
		joined by a number of other people with specific interest in promoting			
		Eucharistic Adoration. Their main focus is to arrange 40 hours Adoration in			
		Marlow in October around the feast of St Carlo Acutis.			
		iii. The clergy had discussed how the many bodies across our diocese work			
		together, where is the line of command and how are decisions made? Fr Sean			
		had raised this with the Council of Priests and also at the DPC. The DPC had			
		agreed that this needs to be considered and they would set up a working group			
		to look into this.			
		iv. The DPC are keen to hold another diocesan assembly in 2026. Consideration is			
		being given to a theme and initial arrangements.			
	3.3	Update from Chairs/Dean Zoom meeting and meeting with Bishop David			
		Joan reported on the meeting of Chairs and Deans held via Zoom.			
		i. They had had a similar discussion around the number of committees in the			
		diocese and their roles.			
		ii. Neil Roseman had given a presentation about communication, CASPAR and the			
		proposed page on the Diocesan website for the pastoral areas. It is not clear			
		how this might be maintained and who would be responsible for this.			
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		iii. CASPAR - parish information can be taken from the diocesan directory, though			
		people are more likely to follow their own parish website for information.			
		iv. Aylesbury pastoral area had completed the listening process and produced a			
		pastoral area plan. They are now preparing to move to the action phase – <u>click</u>			

		 here for full report – which covers all main aspects of parish life. They had consulted over 400 people across their pastoral area. v. Luton and North Northants pastoral areas will simultaneously be the next areas to undertake the listening process. vi. We should now be thinking how we can prepare people in our pastoral area for the time when we will be asked to do the listening process. We could be training facilitators who could lead conversations in the Spirit. 	ALL
	3.4	Update on Chairs Meeting with Bishop David	
		Joan had attended the meeting of PA chairs with Bishop David on 1st March. Six PAs had been represented, all are at different stages of maturity in working together. i. Joan had reported on how our parishes were working together. At present we are working to develop a series of Jubilee initiatives across the pastoral area and trying to create a 'community of communities' where people in similar ministries can meet and support each other. ii. Bishop David had noted there are a large number of building projects in each pastoral area and talked about reaching out to new people moving in. We should not hesitate to reach out to schools and embrace new families. He had stressed the importance of embracing new cultures. This is already happening in some geographic areas. iii. How can we work together to support local charities and how can we pray together? How well do we understand the needs in our local area and how do we respond to them? We're all called to serve through our Baptismal promises. iv. It was proposed to have an annual meeting of Chairs with Bishop David with an informal meeting of chairs in the Autumn. v. Joan had distributed copies of our Christmas booklet and other pastoral areas may adopt this initiative. Working together promotes the message that each parish is part of a broader Catholic family and smaller parishes benefit due to economy of scale in working together.	ALL
