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The Safeguarding advisory board is in early stages of planning a Loud Fence event in Luton. Safeguarding training had gone well. There are very few priests not now trained. **Tuesday 20<sup>th</sup> May** -International Day of Prayer for Victims and Survivors of Abuse. **Exploring Safeguarding:** join our Called & Equipped group as we take a look at safeguarding and what it means for ourselves and our parishes. This is an opportunity for those in parish ministries to get a better understanding of safeguarding from our diocesan safeguarding team, Danielle Dixon and Laura Lester. The venue is Holy Ghost ALL Church, Luton on Saturday 8 March from 10am-1pm. Previous groups have found the presentation very inspiring and the best safeguarding training they have ever received. click here to register Whilst there was an input that people do not wish to complete multiple training courses, which has already been fed through to the Diocesan Safeguarding Coordinator, they must complete our diocesan courses - level 1 for all volunteers (reading a simple leaflet) and **DcnPeter** level 3 if they need a DBS clearance for a parish ministry online. If they carry out work for another organisation, which extends beyond our diocese, for example SVP, or school teachers, they will have to undergo the training required by that organisation. It actually will not save on overheads as these are all online resources. 9. **OUTSTANDING ACTIONS** 9.1 Caritas Maria Cox, Maria Plummer and Fr Sean had met with Brian Emmanuel who is our local Caritas representative. The Caritas Mission statement is "To serve the world's poor, vulnerable and marginalized people - what does Caritas expect from PACs? There are many organisations involved in social justice. Caspar should be able to provide an overview of services we offer but this is not yet available. Maria handed out a form for lay representatives to complete for their parish outlining outreach services they provide so that she could collate what outreach we are offering Lay Reps across the pastoral area.
